A Report from the Bicentenary Celebrations Committee

This Committee has been established by United Church boards in the Northeast Avalon to have joint events next year to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the establishment of Methodism here in 1815. It was only that denomination in this area to join The United Church of Canada in its founding in 1925.

The United churches today are Gower Street, Portugal Cove, Topsail, Pouch Cove, George Street, Bauline, Cochrane Street, Wesley, Bell Island, First United, St. James and Cowan Heights.

The primary celebration event will be a joint worship service on April 26, 2015, with The Right Rev. Dr. Gary Paterson, Moderator, as guest and preacher. The service will be held at Gower Street United Church, though planned and conducted by the clergypersons and others of our churches.

We are also writing a book which will include an account of the beginnings of Methodism in the area, a brief history of each of our churches and descriptions of their present programs. Also described will be churches that operated in the area for a period and are no longer functioning. It will also cover activities of our joint services, such as the food bank.

In another project we are obtaining names of those who made up the first congregation in 1815 and as much information about them as we can get. We have found many more than the five mentioned in books. We will be making them public soon especially to learn if they still have descendants who may have additional information about the events.

We will provide descriptions of other projects through the church bulletins and members on the Committee.

We do not consider our mandate as exclusive. If members of individual churches wish to have additional events of their own, we have no objection; in fact, we encourage it. We would suggest, however, that we inform each other of our events and attempt to avoid conflicting times.
