A bronze plaque, commemorating the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Methodism in the Northeast

**Avalon** and containing the names of the present United Churches on the Northeast Avalon, has recently been installed in downtown St. John's. It is the product of the Bicentenary Celebrations Committee made up of representatives of United Churches in the area. The plaque was installed to commemorate the founding of Methodism in this area in 1815, their first minister Rev. John Pickavant, and their first little chapel. That makes this year the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of an event that ultimately produced all the present United Churches in this area.

That Methodist congregation, with their first minister, must have been very pleased when they had their first service in the chapel at Christmas. However, disaster struck in February when a large fire burned down their precious chapel. The congregation was determined to build another one right away and to have it finished for the following Christmas. They decided not to build on the land they used for the first chapel; it was too crowded with houses for them. They chose instead to use the land that is now that of Gower Street United Church.

When the Bicentenary Celebrations Committee planned the plaque, they decided it should be erected outside and preferably in the location of the first little chapel. As there were no church records indicating its exact location, we found one record suggesting it was not far from the east end of the wall holding the steps between Duckworth Street and Victoria Street. Eventually, the St. John's City staff prepared the area sufficiently secure for the plaque, and that is where it was mounted last month.

The plaque was dedicated by The Right Rev. Dr. Gary Paterson, Moderator, in the special joint worship service at Gower Street United on April 26 of this year. The Committee thanks Doug Peters for all his help and patience.
