Sacrament of Holy Communion

The Invitation: The table of bread and wine is now to be made ready. It is the table of company with Jesus, and all who love Him. It is the table of sharing with the poor of the world, with whom Jesus identified Himself. It is the table of

communion with the earth, in which Christ became incarnate. So come to this table, you who have much faith and you who would like to have more; you who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time; you who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have failed; come. It is Christ who invites us to meet Him here.

The Story of the Last Supper: Blessed is our brother Jesus, who walks with us on the road of our world's suffering, and who is known to us in the breaking of the bread and the pouring of the wine. After having blessed it, He broke the bread and gave it to His disciples, saying, *"This is My body, given to you."* In the same way, He took wine and having given thanks for it, He poured it out and gave the cup to His disciples, saying, *"This is the new relationship with God, sealed with My blood. Take this and share it. I shall drink wine with you next in the coming Kingdom of God."*Let us pray together.

All: Loving God, through Your goodness we have this bread and wine to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. May we know Your presence in the sharing of this bread, so that we may know Your touch in all bread and all matter. We celebrate the life that Jesus has shared among His community through the centuries. We celebrate the life that Jesus shares with us now. Made one in Christ and one with each other, we offer these gifts and with them, ourselves. We are a single, holy living sacrifice. Amen.

The Prayer of Consecration: Hear us, O Christ, and breathe Your Spirit upon us and upon this bread and wine. May they become for us Your body, vibrant with Your life, healing, renewing and making us whole. And as the bread and wine, which we now eat and drink, reminds us of You and Your ministry, may we in turn become whole, living and caring in the world.

Prayers of the People and the Lord's Prayer
