Opening Responses:

Part A:

One: Thanks be to You, O God, that we have risen this day.

All: To the rising of this life itself

One: be the purpose of God between us and each purpose.

All: The hand of God between us and each hand, the pain of Christ between us

and each love.

One: O God, who brought us to the bright light of this day.

All: bring us to the guiding light of eternity.

All: Generous God and Generous Savior, touch us through Your spirit.

Call to Prayer:

One: We gather in God's name.

All: We claim Christ's promised presence.

One: My brothers and sisters, not out of dread and fear, but believing that God is

faithful to forgive, let us rid ourselves of what we need to carry no longer.

Silence

Prayer of Confession and Restoration: Eternal God, Maker of the skies above, lowly Christ born amidst the growing earth, Spirit of life, wind over the flowing waters in earth, sea and sky, You are there. O hidden mystery, sun behind all suns, soul behind all souls, in everything we touch, in everyone we meet, Your presence is around us, and we give thanks. But when we have not touched but trampled You in creation, when we have not met but missed You in another, when we have not received but rejected You in the poor, forgive us, and hear now our plea for mercy.

Silence

Hear now the words of Jesus for all who are truly sorry and seek to renew their lives: "Your sins are forgiven. Go in peace, come and follow me."

Silence

All: Lead us now, O God, to acknowledge Your costly generosity by living as forgiven people, until heaven and earth rejoice and the whole earth cries *Glory!* through Christ our Lord. Amen.

One: Let us prepare ourselves for the Word of God as it comes to us in the reading of Holy Scripture.

All: Our hearts and minds are open.

Affirmation of Faith: A New Creed

The Invitation: The table of bread and wine is now to be made ready. It is the table of company with Jesus, and all who love Him. It is the table of sharing with the poor of the world, with whom Jesus identified Himself. It is the table of communion with the earth, in which Christ became incarnate. So come to this table, you who have much faith and you who would like to have more; you who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time; you who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have failed; Come. It is Christ who invites us to meet him here.

The Story of the Last Supper: Blessed is our brother Jesus, who walks with us on the road of our world's suffering, and who is known to us in the breaking of the bread and the pouring of the wine.

After having blessed it, He broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying, "This is my body, given to you." In the same way He took wine and having given thanks for it, He poured it out and gave the cup to His disciples, saying, "This is the new relationship with God, sealed with My blood. Take this and share it. I shall drink wine with you next in the coming Kingdom of God." Let us pray together.

All: Loving God, through Your goodness we have this bread and wine to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. May we know Your presence in the sharing of this bread, so that we may know Your touch in all bread and all matter. We celebrate the life that Jesus has shared among His community through the centuries. We celebrate the life that Jesus shares with us now. Made one in Christ and one with each other, we offer these gifts and with them ourselves. We are a single, holy living sacrifice. Amen.

The Prayer of Consecration: Hear us, O Christ, and breathe Your Spirit upon us and upon this bread and wine. May they become for us Your body, vibrant with Your life, healing, renewing and making us whole. And as the bread and wine, which we now eat and drink, reminds us of You and Your ministry, may we in turn become whole, living and caring in the world.

The Communion: Look, the Body of Christ is broken for the life of the world. Here is the Christ coming to us in bread and in wine: the gifts of God for the people of God.

Sharing the Bread and the Wine

Sharing the Peace:

One: Many grains were gathered together to make this bread, many grapes were mixed to make this journey. So we who are many, and come from many places, are one in Christ. May the peace of Christ be with you.

All: And also with you.

You are invited to share the peace with one another.

Blessing:

One: May the everlasting God shield you east and west and wherever you go. And the blessing of God be with you. The Blessing of the God of Life be with you. The blessing of Christ be upon you.

All: The Blessing of the Christ of Love.

One: The blessing of the Spirit be upon you.

All: The blessing of the Spirit of Grace.

One: The blessing of God our Creator, Jesus our Friend and Savior and the Holy Spirit, love's power be upon you, now and forevermore.

All: Amen.

Closing song: *Jesus Remember me*

Dismissal:

One: Let us go into the world rejoicing. It is Christ who goes before us.

All: Thanks be to God. Amen.
