Minute for Mission: Our gifts to M&S support programs for migrant workers. Migrant populations arriving in Korea are a relatively new phenomenon. From 1997 to 2011 the immigration numbers went from 380,000 to 1.4 million. Some migrants come to work in the factories, others as marriage migrants. Whatever the reason, M&S partners the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea (PROK) to welcome newcomers and help them adjust to their new land. PROK is responding to many social service needs by providing cultural orientation and language training, helping workers understand their rights and advocating for workers when those rights are not upheld, helping workers who become unemployed or fall ill and staffing hotlines for marriage migrants who find themselves in situations of domestic abuse and violence. PROK's Migrant Workers Centre addresses needs that are as many and varied as the people they serve. We sing thanksgiving for the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea, our M&S partner that reaches out to people in need.
