EDAN has partnered with the organization *Women Challenged to Challenge* to address the issues of poverty these women face. In Kenya, EDAN and *Women Challenged to Challenge* have established a revolving loan fund that gives women with disabilities access to modest business loans. The loans, averaging \$50 US, allow women to run their own small scale businesses ranging from vegetable stalls, selling used clothing or making food to sell. No matter the business, what the loans provide is opportunity for women to improve their families' lives and provide shelter, food, clothing and an education for their children. We sing thanksgiving that M&S is supporting women disabilities in Kenya to improve their families' lives.
