Minute for Mission: Our gifts for M&S support the Near East Council of Churches (NECC } in caring for children in the midst of the shattered infrastructure of the Gaza Strip. Clinics in Shijaia, DarraJ and Rafah estimate anemia and malnutrition affect some 10,000 children from new born to age 6. If treated, 60% of these children will fully recover. Parents and children are welcome at the clinics; the NECC runs outreach programs for families who need service but cannot get to clinics. In addition to the children treated as noted, about 22,000 well baby checks are carried out annually. Children with more complex diagnoses are referred for advanced services. Living in the Gaza Strip is harsh; The NECC reports a shortfall of about 40% in essential drugs needed for mother and child health services. The exposure to health risks continues to increase (spread of communicable diseases, food insecurity, psychosocial issues) as the economic impact of the ongoing blockade and other factors means families have less capacity to contribute to medical costs. M&S makes it possible for the NECC to address the challenges of providing medical care to children in the Gaza Strip.
