Minute for Mission

Our gifts for M&S support community ministries like Back Door Mission in Oshawa. For more than 20 years Back Door Mission has helped to relieve the burdens of poverty and social dislocation experienced by those living in economically depressed circumstances in Oshawa. Over 100 people come to the doors of the facility every day. Its drop-in center offers a welcoming space where people can find shelter, companionship, and a snack or light meal. The drop-in program provides an opportunity for community within a socially disconnected and often stigmatized population. It also serves as a place where the poor, generally physically or mentally disabled in some form, can find friends and the experience of belonging. One family whose lives have been changed by the ministry of the Back Door Mission had been in great distress. The husband had lost his job to work injury; disability payments were inadequate to meet the family basic needs, resulting in them losing their home. They went to a homeless shelter, then emergency housing before resorting to living in their car. While the family faced crisis after crisis with the support of Back Door, they are finally finding ways to navigate the social assistance network. Loving our neighbour is at the heart of our Mission & Service.
