He has grown in skill to become one of the main bakers. Zhou is constantly learning new techniques, proudly mastering each new challenge. He is so proud in the tasty baked goods he produces that he has become the face of the Amity Bakery on billboards and posters. At the Amity Foundation's 30th Anniversary, it was Zhou who welcomed everyone and invited guests to taste the cake he and other bakers had prepared. We are thankful for the loving way that the Amity Foundation offers developmentally challenged individuals the opportunity to live out their passion for creating and learning.
