Minute for Mission: Supervised ministry education is an intentional learning experience that enables people preparing for ministry to deepen their pastoral identity, reflect theologically and enhance their ministry skills. M&S supports this by providing a grant to a learning site, like a congregation, for an 8 month placement. The Rev. Maya Braithwaite recently completed a placement at Bloor Street UC, Toronto.
