# Easter 2019

"Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed." – John 20:1




## Explaining our Finances: How do we spend your gifts of treasure?

Did you ever wonder where St. James gets the money it needs to operate, and how that money is spent?


Hopefully these graphs will help us all better understand our finances and how that affects the accomplishments of our congregation. They're based on 2018 results.

Approximately 77% of our revenue comes from the weekly and special collections. This is obviously the main way in which we can all participate in the mission and accomplishments of our church.

#### Where the money goes:






## **Finance Report Part 2**

Like most organizations, salaries account for the largest part of our expenditure, and there are very few ways to manage that without changing a significant portion of what we do. In 2018 we implemented a test to supplement the Minister of Visitation position with a congregational visitation team. This test will be reviewed in June. If successful, this move would reduce salary costs, but it will only be implemented if the test project provides the visitation services our congregation requires.

## **Breakdown of operating expenses:**



Our 2018 operating expenses are highly affected by the cost of heat (26%), building maintenance (14%) and electricity (9%). Efforts will be made in 2019 to evaluate these (and all costs) to find savings where it is reasonable to do so.

# Looking ahead to 2019:

Our 2019 budget is a realistic budget when compared to previous years. It is a "break-even" budget and does not address last year's deficit or our accumulated debt. Every effort is being made to ensure costs are reasonable and prudent, and where possible, improvements will be made.

# St. James UCW Enjoying Church Work and Church Friends

For, lo, the winter is past, the rain is over and gone; The flowers appear on the earth; the time of the singing of the birds is come, and the voice of the turtle is heard in our land:

What a wondrous time is Spring! The cold and snowy days of winter are past; we celebrate the arrival of blossoming flowers, warmer weather, longer days, and we observe the forty days of Lent leading up to Easter with its message of new life and new hope.

Our United Church Women strive to support the ongoing work of our Church through our financial contributions, specifically the Operating Funds and the Mission and Service Fund, as well as other projects undertaken by church committees throughout the year. As with many other churches, our UCW membership is declining and we would love to have new members join us. We would hope that those who did would find a measure of friendship and fellowship. Meetings are held on the second Monday evening of each month. A warm welcome awaits you.

Throughout the years, there have been many interest groups within our UCW. Crafts and quilting attracted many of our members at one time but these activities have now lost their appeal. There are three such groups still alive and well:

- 1. The St. James Ladies Bowling League. Some of our women have been bowling regularly since it started some fifty years ago! Two of our ninety year olds, Shirley Bursey and Joan Barbour, rarely miss a Tuesday morning at the alleys.
- 2. Our UCW Choir was started by Marie Sturge in 1976, followed by Jean Rose in 1978, and Doreen Brown in 2008. This is a dedicated group of singers and Doreen challenges us and brings out the best in us. Any women in the congregation would be welcomed to this group. Often we sing with the AOTS and Youth Choirs. We know that there are great voices out there. Why not join us?
- 3. The Friendship Group started in 1991. This group is open to any women within or outside our congregation. We meet on the second and fourth Wednesday each month from September to May. Lunch starts

at 1:00 pm followed by a "conversation circle" and a game of cards. Presently we have a membership of twenty-nine and would gladly welcome others.

Our Easter Spring Tea is scheduled for Saturday, April 13 from 2:00-4:00 pm in the church auditorium. Tickets are \$7.00 and are available at the door. This is one of our two fundraisers for the year so please keep this date in mind. Along with great food there are bakery and variety stalls as well as loot and surprise bags. The support we receive from the congregation is welcomed and sincerely appreciated.


