GREETINGS FROM REV. BRIAN COLBOURNE

Luke 2:10 states, "I bring good tidings of great joy for all people." Oh how the world needs a little good news! It seems as if people are becoming immune to the "bad news" we are hearing from around the world, and even here at home. Do the words of the angel as found in Luke 2:10 have any effect on the people of today?

Christmas is a time when people are given a glimpse into God's plan for the world. It is a special time in the year when people are called away from fears and doubts and drawn near, if not into, a deeper sense of the miracle of God's presence. If we listen to the Good News surrounding the birth of Jesus Christ and believe in the promise of His return, we just may experience a good change in our lives...but we must be willing to let our lives be touched by the presence of God.

In Luke 2:12 we read, "This will be a sign to you: you will find the baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Signs are important to us, no matter what form they may take. Many signs were given in the Old Testament directing people to the coming of the Messiah. Few people paid attention, although the signs were clear. In the New Testament the prophecies were fulfilled with the coming of Jesus Christ. How exciting it must have been for the shepherds to receive the message from the angels, as we read in Luke 2.

At Christmas we celebrate the birth of Jesus. In our Advent celebrations we prepare and wait. As we wait, we examine our relationship with God and our relationship with the world through Jesus Christ. Christmas has always been a time for bringing people together. It is also a good time for us to bring healing to any broken relationships we may have. This is just a part of the miracles available through Christ. It can have a transforming effect on our lives, our church and the world.

2019 has been another busy year for St. James United Church. The various groups and committees, as well as many other individuals, have continued doing great work. They are such an important part of our Church Ministry, and we are grateful for those who offer themselves to serve.

CHRISTMAS REFLECTIONS by Vera Marshall

Yesterday, I was asked, "Honey, could you write an item for the Christmas Visitor?" When I agreed, she added, "the deadline for submission is Monday." Today I had my pen and paper ready to write, but before starting I tuned in to VOWR. The Fortunes were singing "Here comes that rainy day feeling again." Just my sentiments, too! It's been raining for days. "Forget that," I said to myself, "you've got a deadline to meet." However, in all likelihood there will be some snow before the Christmas Visitor is delivered.



I have a tote bag filled with UCW material, things that I and others have written, as well as several St. James Visitors dating back to 1981. This afternoon I have spent time re-reading several Christmas Visitors. They are so interesting! I'd like to share excerpts from some of them.

December 1981, Rev. Ray Tucker: "The Spirit of Christmas breaks down barriers, it heals wounds, it creates friendships, it brings people together and it restores families. There is that mystical magic about Christmas that seems to be able to do all of these things for us, and it defies explanation or reason. It is really a miracle; and it seems to happen every year, it never fails."

December 1981, Rev. Nelson Hodder: "There will be many reasons to be thankful in this Christmas season, in this we all agree. There will be expressions of thanks in what will be done to help others. The foremost reason for thanks will be that 'His Wonderful Name' will be spoken and sung with gladness and hope in many lands throughout the world, in many languages, in many hearts, and so will continue for ages to come."

December 1988, Rev. Bobby Fillier: "Long for and walk in a search for hope this Christmas, hope found in the Christ child and in the finding of your personal hope, a future that leads you on forever. Then pass the joy of your discovery to members of your family, friends and others who would join with you in the journey of life."

December 1998, Vera Marshall: "Soon the Christmas story from scriptures, the legendary writings, and the beautiful carols will be retold and rendered throughout the world. Photographs of gaily decorated trees and homes, wide eyed children and family gatherings will be captured. These are customary memories to be preserved and cherished. There are other Christmas memories not so ordinary, of special people and times—these are memories of the heart."

I would imagine that there have been more words written and composed about Christmas than any other event in history. Some are timeless and hopefully will be read and sung for ages.

On December 9 UCW and AOTS will come together to share a Christmas evening with a dinner and entertainment—just what church family should be doing. Recently our UCW and AOTS choirs have combined to bring leadership to some Sunday services. We are led by the capable and jovial Doreen Brown.

I leave you now with words from an anthem we will be sharing with you during the Christmas season.

We will hear solo and small ensemble performances from all classes, as well as a very special performance from our Project Grace Youth Orchestra. We invite all our friends and family to join us for this annual holiday event, which will feature many popular melodies! Admission is by freewill donation at the door. This concert will be sure to get you in the holiday spirit!

This fall we also ran an eight-week session of Music Lessons for Grownups! This semester featured lessons on ukulele and flute. We are considering running piano lessons for grownups during the winter semester – please let us know if you would like to participate!
