"The angel said to the woman, 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; He is risen, just as He said'." (Matthew 28:5-6)

Dear Friends:

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

It seems like only last month I was preparing words for our Christmas newsletter. This is another indication that we have no way of slowing down the passing of time. We do, however, have the opportunity to decide how to spend the precious time we have.

As I reflect on the words of scripture quoted above, I realize just how easy it is to have fear when we face the unknown. The women went to the tomb that morning expecting to find the body of Jesus. It was difficult enough for them to visit his tomb, but now his body was gone.

"What was happening?" "What did this mean?" Nothing made sense to them. Their first thought was that someone must have taken his body, but "why?"

They were filled with so many questions and then fear set in. It was very difficult for them to understand what was happening. Then the angelic voice spoke to them, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; He is risen, just as He said".

They could have gotten lost in their fear and confusion, but the story did not end there. Words of hope and a reminder of his promise brought them out of their fear into a new hope. It brought them into a "new day".

Easter reminds us of the Good News that the old can be made new through the power of the living God.

We live in an "ever changing" world; our sense of safety and security is changing, our community and society are changing, and even our church is continuing in the process of change. And now we are living in a very frightening time as the world is dealing with the Coronavirus. Something that has moved throughout the world and has caused fear in many. It has caused many changes in the way we live and the way we communicate with each other, the way we interact and yes, even the way we worship. It has caused fear and uncertainty.

It leaves us wondering with a sense of fear, "where will it all end?"

At Easter time in our Christian Faith, we focus not only on the crucifixion and the tomb, but we also focus on the fact of the empty tomb and the Risen Christ. This is where we find new hope; this is the Good News. God is with us and we are not alone. We live in God's world.

We need not be afraid of what is, or of what might be, because the One who cares for us holds the past, the present, and the future.

As we journey through Easter, we are called to hear the words which bring the Easter story to life again. For some, it will be a time of reflection as to what this Jesus of Nazareth really means to us as individuals. For others, it may have very little effect on what is happening in the world today.

Jesus becomes so much more real to us when we journey with him to the cross of Calvary, past the empty tomb, and into the Resurrection story.

The song writer Ira Stanphill, wrote the words:

Many things about tomorrow I don't seem to understand, But I know who holds tomorrow And I know who holds my hand.

Throughout the days of uncertainty, we are called to be a people of faith as we walk with Christ. And as a people of faith we are able to find hope in the promises of God.

As we work and pray together for the future of our families, our church, our community, and the world, let us put our trust in God and God's plan for each one of us. Only with God's help are we able to discover and experience the miracle of the Easter Story.

God be with you and bless you as we continue to be an Easter people.




