Message from our Treasurer:

"These past 10 months have been very challenging financially for St. James with Rev. Brian retiring, the church being closed from March to September, and protocols to follow in order to re-enter the church for services. Our UCW, AOTS, Senior Choir, Guitar Group and all other groups have not been able to meet, which is very difficult. Financially, we have availed of the several Federal Government Programs to help us out: Canada Employee Wage Subsidy, where we can claim 75% of our wages with some restrictions, and the Canada Emergency Business Account where we received a \$40,000 loan with only \$30,000 being repaid by December 2022.
