Questions for thought (teens and adults)

Read - Luke 1:68–79

Zechariah had given up hope on receiving the thing he wanted most. When invited to hope again, he asked for proof.

■ What inspires you to hope beyond reason?

Perhaps there was a miraculous intervention that caused Zechariah to stop talking. Perhaps the messenger's visit was so traumatic that he lost his capability for speech. There is modern, western medical research to support this idea. Perhaps Zechariah took a vow of silence for a time due to a belief that fulfillment of the promise depended on his response. Monks all over the world participate in this practice.

- What do you think might have caused Zechariah's silence?
- How would your life change if you participated in periods of silence during this Advent season?
- When Zechariah's silence ended, he speaks, perhaps sings, about forgiveness, knowledge, mercy, and love that is timeless and yet present in a new way because of the birth of this child.
- Where have you been silent or silenced?
- What could you say about God's goodness in order to break the silence?


Paper Plate Angel

Zechariah looked and saw what seemed to be an angel. The angel had a special message. Make a paper plate angel to help you tell the story about Zechariah, Elizabeth, and baby John.

You will need paper plate, scissors, stapler, markers and coloured pencils, glitter glue

Instructions

1. Draw cutting lines on the paper plate.



2. Cut along the marked lines and round off the arms and head.



3. Decorate the angel.



- 4. Connect edges of the skirt and secure with a staple.
- 5. Flatten crimped edges of the wings

- 6. Bend the wings back and the head forward slightly.
- 7. Tell the story of Zechariah, Elizabeth, and John. Or use the angel to announce other good news.
