

READINGS: John 20:19-31; Acts 5:27-32; and "Walking with My Delaware Grandfather" by Denise Low

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (based on bible verses)

One: We gather as a community in faith, each affirming our own understanding of that faith. As both many and one, let us offer words used by our ancestors, expressed in these passages from scripture:

All: With Peter we proclaim to Jesus:

One: With Thomas we proclaim: "My Lord and my God!"

Two: And with John we uphold this truth:

All: May these ancient words bring wisdom to our hearts.
