WELCOMING ALL TO THE TABLE

GREAT THANKSGIVING PRAYER

One: God be with you. All: And also with you. One: Open your hearts. All: We open them to God.

One: Let us give thanks. All: It is good to give thanks and praise.

One: It is good to thank you, Eternal Creator. All that you have made is beautiful and good: darkness and light, growth and change. So much lies beyond the scope of our knowledge and imagination, for you alone are Wisdom's source. Brought forth from you long before the oceans were formed, or the mountains set, she speaks in every age, revealing how our wisdom seems like foolishness to you.

Through her you reached out to us at Mount Sinai to reveal your sacred teaching, sent prophets to call us back to your way, and in Jesus, the Word made flesh, embraced our struggle, showing us your love even when we rejected him and nailed him to a tree.

And so we praise you, joining your angels and saints in their song:

All: O holy, holy Lord, O God of time and space. All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest heav'n, creations sings your praise. And blessed is the One who comes and bears your name always. (MV 203)

It is good to praise you, Living Source, especially as we remember Jesus, who transformed the cross into Wisdom's Tree of Life. We recall how on the night before he died, he shared a meal with friends. He took bread, gave you thanks, broke it and gave it to them saying: "Take and eat. This is my body, given for you." In the same way, at the end of the meal, he took a cup of wine. He thanked you and gave it to them, saying: "Drink this, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in my life's blood. Whenever you do this, do it in memory of me."

And we do remember, praising you for the faithfulness of his life, the sacrifice of his death, the wonder of the resurrection, the promise of his abiding presence. And so we proclaim:

All: Sing Christ has died and Christ is risen, Christ will come again! (x2) (More Voices 204)

Enlivening God, as we continue to celebrate his memory, we honour your presence with us. Open our hearts to your Spirit with us and in this meal. Brood over us that we may be one body in Christ, called to be your people of truth and reconciliation. May we walk in right relations with all your children: as good stewards of creation, seekers of justice for any and all who are oppressed, courageous bearers of your wisdom in all that we say and do.

We offer this act of praise and thanksgiving, Gracious God:
Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours

O God of Wisdom, now and forever.

All: Amen, amen, O Holy one! Hosanna and Amen! (x2) (MV 205)

THE PRAYER OF JESUS (The Lord's Prayer)

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy king-dom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

SHARING COMMUNION

One: This is the bread of life, broken to give life to the world. This the fruit of the vine, love poured out that all may truly live. This is the banquet of blessing, Christ among us in our sharing.

All: Thanks be to God.

There is a station for bread and side stations with juice in communion glasses. Please consume the bread and juice before returning to your pew. If you are unable to come forward to share in communion, someone will bring it to you once everyone who wishes to has received.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION (in unison)

We give thanks Holy God for our gathering at your table. May this wisdom feast continue to strengthen us as we go into the world to walk in peace, love and a spirit of healing with all of creation. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.




