#### INVITATION TO THE TABLE

#### THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

One: Christ is risen! All: Hallelujah! Christ is risen indeed!

One: Open your hearts. All: We open them to God.

One: Let us give thanks. All: It is good to give thanks & praise.

One: Holy God, we praise you. You are beyond our understanding, but we know one thing – you are love. Through your love, you made everything – the stars and planets, the sun and moon, trees, flowers, birds, animals, and us, your children. **All: Hallelujah!** 

One: With that same love you taught us how to live, called on holy people to remind us what is good, and sent Jesus to show us what it means to truly live. **All: Hallelujah!** 

One: He drew on your love in everything he did. He healed sick people, cared for those who were poor, wept with people who were sad, forgave people and taught us to forgive each other. He loved everyone and showed us how to be kind. All: Hallelujah!

One: And with love you bring us together so we can praise you: Holy God of Power of Might! Hallelujah! Heav'n and earth shine with your light! Hallelujah! Loud Hosannas now we sing! Hallelujah! Blessings to our Risen King! Hallelujah!

One: Holy God, we thank and praise you for this time each year when we celebrate the power of your love! Faithful to you until the very end, Jesus died on a cross. His friends wept as they placed his body in a tomb, but three days later when they went to the tomb it was empty, and an angel told them Jesus was no longer there. With them we shout in joy. **All: Hallelujah!** 

One: Holy God, we thank you that Jesus continues to be with us, reminding us how to share your love. We thank you for this meal as we recall how on the night before he died, he shared supper with his friends. While they were eating, he took bread, gave you thanks, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you." After supper, he took a cup of wine. Again he thanked you, and gave it to his friends, saying, "Take, drink. This is a sign of the new covenant in my life's blood. Whenever you do this, remember me."

One: Holy God, we do remember. We remember Jesus' love, his friendship, his teaching, his dying, and his rising to life again:

All: Dying, Christ destroyed our death! Hallelujah! Rising, Christ restores our life! Hallelujah! We believe and we proclaim, Hallelujah! Jesus Christ will come again! Hallelujah!

A Petition to Help Kids in Our Neighbourhood: Did you know that there are 29 students living in the area of Terra Nova Road/Valleyview Apartments/Crosbie Road/Portia Place that are being denied access to education? They attend St. Andrews Elementary School but are not given a bus because they are included in the 'family responsibility zone'. Few of these families, many of whom are newcomers to Canada, have vehicles. These children have no other choice but to make a 3 km round trip twice a day along busy roads. In the winter it is very dangerous because few of the sidewalks are passable. Parents must walk with their young children to school. It is not uncommon for a parent to accompany their school aged child while also pushing a stroller or holding a toddler's hand. Without safe transportation, many of these children miss school. A group of parents have been trying to get their children bussed to school but have been ignored by the School District for two years. These families need our help to amplify their voices. Please sign the petition asking the school district to finally help these families. The petition is available to sign at the church.
