

A Petition to Help Kids in Our Neighbourhood: Did you know that there are 29 students living in the area of Terra Nova Road /Valleyview Apartments/Crosbie Road/Portia Place that are being denied access to education? They attend St. Andrews Elementary School but are not given a bus because they are included in the 'family responsibility zone'. Few of these families, many of whom are newcomers to Canada, have vehicles. These children have no other choice but to

make a 3 km round trip twice a day along busy roads. In the winter it is very dangerous because few of the sidewalks are passable. Parents must walk with their young children to school. It is not uncommon for a parent to accompany their school aged child while also pushing a stroller or holding a toddler's hand. Without safe transportation, many of these children miss school. A group of parents have been trying to get their children bussed to school but have been ignored by the School District for two years. These families need our help to amplify their voices. Please sign the petition asking the school district to finally help these families. The petition is available to sign at the church.
