First Reading: 2 Samuel 7:1-16

Psalm 89:1-4, 19-26 (please read aloud the bold portions)

I will sing of your steadfast love, O God, forever;

with my mouth I will proclaim your faithfulness to all generations.

I declare that your steadfast love is established forever;

your faithfulness is as firm as the heavens.

You said, "I have made a covenant with my chosen one, I have sworn to my servant David:

'I will establish your descendants forever, and build your throne for all generations.'"

Then you spoke in a vision and said: "I have set the crown on one who is mighty, I have exalted one chosen from the people.

I have found my servant David; with my oil I have anointed him; my hand shall remain with him; my arm shall strengthen him.

REFLECTION FOLLOWING THE READINGS

We Respond

* **HYMN:** "O Come All Ye Faithful" *Voices United* 60, v. 1, 3, 4 and 5 (*Please change "this morning" to "that morning" in verse 5.*)

INVITATION TO THE TABLE

One: Jesus came to bring God's hope and peace to the world. All: In table fellowship may we know his joy and his love.

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

One: God is here.All: God is within and around us.One: Open your hearts.All: We gladly open them to God.One: Let us give thanks.All: It is good to give thanks and praise.

One: It is good to praise you, God of promise, as we gather on this final Advent morning. We thank you for Jesus: born in Bethlehem, proclaimed by the Baptizer, bearer of good news for the world.

All: We give thanks too for the words of prophets, for the courage of Mary and Joseph, for the song of the angels.

One: With them we raise our own voices in praise:

All sing: Holy, holy, holy! My Heart, my heart adores you! My heart is glad to say the words, You are holy God! Holy, holy, holy. Hosanna in the highest! Let all creation praise and pray: Save us holy God!

One: God of hope we give thanks, for the child born to us did not stay in a manger but grew in wisdom and announced your reign. He grew up to heal the tormented, confront the powers, and make present your mercy. Arrested for his witness to your truth, he was put to death; in fulfillment of your promise, you raised him to life.

All: We give thanks for his birth long ago; for his life of hope and teachings of love, teachings lived out profoundly at table.

One: He embodied these teachings on the night before he died. Gathered with his friends, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them saying, "This is my body, given for you."

In the same way he took a cup at the end of the meal, and after blessing it, gave it to them saying, "This is a sign of the new covenant in my life's blood. Whenever you do this, remember me."

God of peace, we remember as we gather around this table, open to your presence as we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

All: Christ has died, is risen, will come again to meet us; And walks with us the Way of his love. Holy kingdom, come!

One: God of wisdom, open our hearts to the presence of your Spirit flowing within us and through these gifts. As you touched Mary and Jesus with Spirit's breath, so fill us with your power.

All: Renew us through this holy meal and send us pregnant with your grace to bear your love to the world.

One: Holy One we give you praise. Creator God, we praise you, through Your Word made flesh, in the power of your life-giving Spirit, now and forever.

All sing: Holy, holy, holy. Amen we pray, with longing. Let all creation cry Amen! Holy kingdom, come!

THE PRAYER OF JESUS (based on the original Aramaic):

Radiant One: your Name shines within us, outside us - even darkness shines in you. Create your reign now, that your one desire acts with ours. Grant what we need each day in bread and insight. Forgive our hidden past, our secret shames, as we forgive what others hide. Keep us from forgetfulness, the temptation of false appearances and free us to walk your path with light and joy. For from you arises every vision; to you returns the birthing glory of the cosmos. Amen.

SHARING IN COMMUNION

Everyone is welcome to share communion – all ages, beliefs, identities and life experiences. Come to the front to receive the bread and grape juice (in a glass).

Consume both before returning to your pew. Please let us know if you need the gluten free option. If you're unable to come to the front, someone will bring communion to you.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION (*in unison*)

God of blessing, we give thanks for your grace revealed in Mary's child, experienced anew in bread and wine. Strengthen us as your children called to share the gift of your love. Amen.
