Jesus welcomed all to share meals with him. In this he made it known that all people shine in God's love. Here at this and many tables in our community, we experience that same renewing gift.

We share this meal knowing that God is within and around us.

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

God be with you. **And also with you.** Open your hearts. **We open them to the Holy.** Let us give thanks. **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

It is good to give thanks to you, Maker of heaven and earth. At the beginning of time, light blazed forth from your splendour, and the cosmos was born – stars, quasars, planets and moons, and the gift of life in all its dazzling array. Among the living you made and called humankind, imprinting us with your image and calling us to bear your presence in the world. Too often we hid your image within us, and yet you continued to invite us into relationship and fulfilled your mission by calling a people for yourself, sending them to bear your light in the world. In gratitude, we join with the whole company of heaven in their hymn of praise to your name:

O Holy, holy, holy God. O God of time and space. All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest heav'n, creation sing your praise. And blessed is the one who comes and bears your name always!

Hosanna to you, Holy God, and blessed is your Child Jesus whom you sent in your name. In him we not only see the fullness of your glory, but in his life of mercy and love he helped all that he met to see again your image shining in them. For this we thank you and are grateful too that as his journey to Jerusalem drew near, Jesus took his closest friends up a high mountain where you pulled back the veil of heaven and revealed your light shining though him. We catch a glimpse of that light now as we gather at this table.

Here we remember how on the night before his death he gathered at table with his friends. During the meal, he took bread, gave you thanks, broke it and shared it with them, saying: "Take, eat; this is my body, given for you." In the same way at the end of the meal he took the cup, gave you thanks, and shared it with them saying: "Drink from this, all of you; this is the sign of the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you eat and drink, do so in memory of me."

In his memory, we offer you our work and our lives, the power of his death and resurrection imaged in our lives of mercy and love: Sing Christ has died and Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

Open our hearts to the gift of your Spirit present here, revealed in bread and wine. Make them to be for us the living presence of your Beloved Child, that we too may be his beloved, one family in that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters. Make us one with him and each other, one in ministry as we are called in his name to shine with his transforming love in the world. Creator God, we praise you, through Your Word made flesh, in the power of your life-giving Spirit, now and forever. **Amen, amen, O Holy One, Hosanna and Amen.**

Members have volunteered their time to be available for consultation and assistance in the completion of income tax returns at several public clinics located throughout St. John's and Mount Pearl.

Senior citizens with total personal income of \$35,000 or less and other individuals with income of \$25,000 or less qualify for this free service. The program excludes all persons with self-employment or rental income or income from foreign sources.
