Contribution Statements: The 2023 contribution statements have gone out in the mail. If you have not received yours by the end of February, please let the office know.

Snow/Rain Delay: Wild light Spiritual Oasis that was set to take place this afternoon February 25th has been delayed until March 3rd.

Eventide Worship: There is no Eventide Worship this evening. Next Sunday will be Taizé Prayer. Taizé is based on the prayer tradition of the interchurch monastery in Taizé, France that is frequented by young people from all over the world, this reflective service uses chants, readings and periods of silence. The music is sung in many languages, repeating simple phrases from the Psalms and other Bible readings.

Reflective Thursdays at 12:30: Each Thursday throughout Lent, (Rev.) James will lead an informal communion service in the Fellowship Room. Communion is at 12:30PM, followed by the sharing of lunch. Bring a bag lunch if you wish and have lunch together!

Make Your Lent Green: This year we are using a green lens as we explore the readings for each Sunday in Lent. Why not make your whole Lent green? One way to do this is to follow the suggestions by A Rocha, a Christian environmental organisation started in the UK. Here is a link to their UK website: <https://arocha.org.uk/go-green-for-lent/>

Reflecting this Week: Each week we are reflecting on an element of creation as we consider the gift of our relationships, including with nature. This week you are invited to consider the element of water. In Isaiah 44, we read how water is sacred, a gift from God that brings forth life. As Christians we honour this spiritually when we use water in the sacrament of baptism. Water is a blessing not only for us but also in its own right, and so it needs to be respected. This is a far cry from how water is viewed in much of the Global North, treated as a commodity to be traded, a resource for agriculture, or a material for use in industry and discarded once it is polluted. We may live in a water-rich world, but only 3 percent of the world's water is fresh rather than salty, and only 1 percent is easily accessible. Beyond this, saltwater is threatened by plastics, and sea life is adversely impacted. Ultimately, water is a finite gift that needs protecting, a sacred source for all of life.

Ask yourself: Do you view water as sacred? In what ways? In Isaiah water is also a symbol of blessing. In what ways is that true for you? How far would you go to protect your own local water source?

A Spiritual Practice: Try to avoid drinking any water (or other beverage) for a day this week. If 11-12 hours is too long, set a timeframe that pushes you without risking your health. Whenever you feel thirsty through the day, pause to pray, perhaps reciting the first verse of Psalm 63: “O God, you are my God; I seek you; my soul thirsts for you.” As you pray, let your heart expand beyond your needs to consider those who do not have access to clean drinking water, people whose water is threatened by industry or who are struggling with drought, and sea life harmed by pollution. When you have your first drink of water at the end of your fasting period, savour your first sip. Consider its taste and how it feels on your tongue. Pause in appreciation and the need for all of us to look after this gift.
