

WELCOMING ALL TO THE TABLE

Jesus welcomed everyone to eat with him as a sign of God's love. He welcomes us too and calls us to bring that love to the world.

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

The Holy One is here. God's Spirit is with us. Open your hearts. We open them to God.

Let us give thanks. It is right to give God thanks & praise.

It is right to praise you, Holy God. In you the heavens are joyful and earth is glad. We praise you for creating the universe, for your wisdom revealed to all peoples, for your promises to your people Israel, for Jesus in whom you reveal your life and love.

Born of Mary, he shares our humanity;
calling his disciples, he invites us to share his mission.
Eating with sinners, he welcomes us;
visiting the sick, he heals us that we may serve one another.
Dying on the cross, he reveals your love;
raised from the dead, he lifts us up and offers new life.
Sitting at you right hand, he prays for us;
sharing his Spirt, he enables us to live your hope in the world.

With thanksgiving, we join the angels song of praise:

O holy, holy Lord, O God of time and space. All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest heav'n, creations sings your praise. And blessed is the One who comes and bears your name always. (MV 203)

Holy God, as we gather at this table, we give thanks for Jesus. We give thanks for the many ways he revealed your life and love, especially how on the night before he died he had supper with his friends. There he took bread, blessed it, broke and gave it to them saying, "Take, eat. This is my body given for you." After the meal he took the cup of wine, blessed it and gave it to them saying, "Take, drink. This is the cup of the new covenant, sealed in my blood. Whenever you do this, remember me."

In grateful memory, we proclaim the mystery of our faith: Sing Christ has died and Christ is risen, Christ will come again! (x2) (More Voices 204)

Be with us through your Spirit, Holy God, that this meal may be our communion in the body of Christ.

Make us one with him and all who share this feast, that we be united in faith, encouraged with hope, inspired to love.

May we share his mission in welcome and service, revealing his goodness

as we serve you faithfully until we feast in your glory.

We praise you, Holy God, though Christ your Word made flesh, in the power of your life-giving Spirit, now and forever.

SHARING COMMUNION

This is the bread of life, **broken to give life to the world.**This the fruit of the vine, **love poured out that all may truly live.**This is the banquet of blessing, **Christ among us in our sharing.**

There is a station for bread and side stations with juice in small glasses. Consume both before returning to your seat. If you are unable to come forward to share communion, someone will bring it to you once everyone who wishes to has already received. If you would prefer a blessing, come forward with arms crossed over your chest as a sign of that request.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION (in unison)

We give thanks, saving God that you have called us to your table and through this meal nurtured us as disciples of your servant Jesus. In union with him, strengthen our faith, increase our love and send us to serve you in the care we show to others. Amen.
