Life and Work - February 23, 2025

No Wild Light Spiritual Oasis this Month: Over the last couple of years, we have scheduled a Wild Light gathering in February, but no one has attended. Given this we will not have a Wild Light gathering this year but focus on coming together to mark the Spring Equinox in March. See you then.

2025 Envelopes: If you have not received your 2025 envelopes, please arrange with the office to pick them up or ask a friend to get them for you. If you are using old envelopes cross of the number and print your name on the envelope. The reason for this is your number might change from year to year and then it gets posted to the wrong account and if there is no name on the envelope we have no way to make sure it gets posted to the correct person. Thank you for your help in this.

A One Stop Shop for Information: Have you seen our Bulletin Boards in the Main Foyer? It is a spot to see upcoming events, volunteer opportunities, information about social action issues, in general a spot to get your information.

Ash Wednesday: This coming March 3 is Ash Wednesday, the opening service of the Season of Lent. This day coincides with our regular Taizé service. As such the Taizé prayers and reflection will include a time when people can receive ashes. There will also be a chance to receive ashes at the end of the worship service on March 9.

Pancake Supper: will be held on Tuesday, March 4 at 6pm. Come enjoy all the favourites; pancakes, berries, beans and sausages, coffee, tea and juice for just \$10 per person (12 years and under \$5). Tickets are available for purchase from Aubrey Hill at (709) 726-8306 or Clyde Flight at (709) 722-9935. Tickets must be purchased in advance.

Bring in Palm Fronds: In preparation for Ash Wednesday (on March 5), please bring in palm fronds from last year (or earlier). They are burned and then the ash is used for the custom of having a cross traced in ash on your forehead.

Shifting to a bulletin-free service: Beginning on March 9, the first Sunday of Lent, we are implementing a Projection only worship service. Life and Work will be available for those who want to take it home and there will be a couple of large print orders of service for people who need it. In addition, you can still dedicate the service in memory of a loved one or to celebrate someone. A few copies of the order of service will be printed for families who wish to have a keepsake of that dedication. This decision of council is intended to not only save money on the cost of paper but will reduce our congregational carbon footprint.

Lenten Bible Study: This coming Lent, Rev. James will be leading a bible study exploring the significance of the cross and the different ways we understand how Jesus' death upon it is spiritually transformative. There are 2 time slots. On Sunday afternoon after fellowship (bring a lunch) and on a weekday evening (day and time TBD by those who wish to participate).

Annual Congregational Meeting: The Annual Congregational Meeting is on Sunday, March 23 at noon. Refreshments will be provided.

Recycling: Did you know that St. James United has its very own Recycling Account? If you'd like to donate your empty bottles, bring them to the Recycling Depot on O'Leary Avenue. Tell them it's for us and we get the refund.

Many years before, the event was known as the blessing of the fleet as people gathered at the local wharves to bless the sealers and their ships as they headed for the front. In 1963 Rev. Naboth Winsor began to hold the service in George Street United. Over the years the focus grew to include all those who harvest the sea and those who make a living on the sea. In 2023 George Street United was decommissioned.
