INVITATION TO THE TABLE

Jesus welcomed everyone to the table as a sign that all people shine in God's love. Here we experience that same renewing gift.

We share this meal knowing God shines within & around us.

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

God be with you. And also with you.

Open your hearts. We open them to the Holy.

Let us give thanks. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is good to give thanks to you, Maker of heaven and earth. At the beginning of time, light blazed forth from your splendour, and the cosmos was born – stars, quasars, planets and moons, and the gift of life in all its dazzling array. Among the living you made and called humankind, imprinting us with your image and calling us to bear your presence in the world. And yet we often hid your image within us, and denied that you shone in others as well. We seek forgiveness, grateful that you kept inviting us into relationship and called a people to bear your light in the world. With thanks, we join with the whole company of heaven in their hymn of praise:

O Holy, holy God. O God of time and space. All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest heav'n, creation sing your praise. And blessed is the one who comes and bears your name always!

Hosanna to you, Holy God, and blessed is your Child Jesus whom you sent in your name. In him we not only see the fullness of your glory, but in his life of mercy and love he helped all that he met to see again your image shining in them. For this we thank you and are grateful too that as his journey to Jerusalem drew near, Jesus took his closest friends up a high mountain where you pulled back the veil of heaven and revealed your light shining though him. We glimpse that light now as we gather at this table.

Here we remember how on the night before his death he and his friends gathered at table. During the meal, he took bread, gave you thanks, broke it and shared it with them, saying: "Take, eat; this is my body, given for you." In the same way, he took the cup, gave you thanks, and shared it with them saying: "Drink from this, all of you; this is the sign of the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you eat and drink, do so in memory of me."

In his memory, we offer you our work and our lives, the power of his death and resurrection imaged in our lives of mercy and love:

Sing Christ has died and Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

Open our hearts to the gift of your Spirit present here, revealed in bread and wine. Make them to be for us the living presence of your Beloved Child, that we too may be his beloved, one family in that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters. Make us one with him and each other, one in ministry as we are called in his name to shine with his transforming love in the world.

Creator God, we praise you, through Your Word made flesh, in the power of your life-giving Spirit, now and forever.

Amen, amen, O Holy One, Hosanna and Amen.

Taizé /Ash Wednesday: This coming March 5 is Ash Wednesday, the opening service of the Season of Lent. *This day coincides with our regular Taizé service*. As such the Taizé prayers and reflection will include a time when people can receive ashes.

Tapestry - Saturday, March 8 @ 5:30PM: Beginning with a potluck at 5:30 pm, this service celebrates the strands that make us who we are in terms of faith **and** experience.
