

TIME OF MEDITATION AND CONFESSION:

Meditating on an image of Jesus as he goes to the cross, we pause to name where we are part of that journey, confessing our wrongdoings.

There is Jesus, carrying his cross... a cruel crown into his brow.

The thought of Jesus being brutalized in this way makes us wince. But Jesus was not the first person to be tortured. He would not be the last. Today countless people are demeaned in service of power: activists locked away by despots, names of "suspects" passed to government agencies, human rights violated - by Western democracies. Spirit of mercy, be with us. May we not turn away as people are abused in the name of "security." Give us courage to face our fear, and strength to respond in the name of love and dignity for all. Amen.
