Prayers of the People: Throughout this Lent, we are making the Prayers of the People really of the people. Last season, we emphasized this by having the worship assistant pray the prayers (that Rev. James wrote). However, this season we will highlight this differently and invite you to let us know what you want prayed for. When you come into the church there will be slips of paper for you to write prayer intentions on and then they will be brought up to the front during the offering. Alternatively, email Rev. Branches for Palm Sunday: It will be Palm Sunday in a couple of weeks (April 13). As done in years past, you are invited to bring in your own branches to wave as part of the procession. It could be a cedar branch or a spruce bough or even some pussy willows (a custom from Ukraine and Poland). Equally you could wave a ribbon, or use a clapper to show your enthusiasm for Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem. This year the gospel says that the people placed cloaks on the ground. In honour of this you could also bring in a gently used coat that we will gather in anticipation of the coat drives often held in the fall.

Online Bible Study Cancelled: For the next two weeks the online bible study is cancelled due to low turnout. Instead, we will focus on our bible study on Sundays after worship.

Lenten Prayer: Along with study, prayer is another important practice during Lent. To this end, Rev. James will be leading centering prayer on Thursdays at 12:15 pm. He will do so via Zoom.
