THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Christ is risen! Hallelujah! Christ is risen indeed! Open your hearts. We open them to God. Let us give thanks. It is good to give God thanks and praise.

It is good to thank and praise you, Living God, creator of heaven and earth. You formed us in your image and breathed into us your holy breath, calling us to be your children. And though at times we forgot that call and wandered from you, you remained steadfast, again and again restoring your people and calling them to be a blessing to the nations. Grateful for this abiding love we join all of your angels and saints in a song of praise:

Holy God of Power of Might! Hallelujah! Heav'n and earth shine with your light! Hallelujah! Loud Hosannas now we sing! Hallelujah! Blessings to our Risen King! Hallelujah!

We praise and thank you Redeeming God, for your Son, Jesus Christ, who through his death, and resurrection, gave birth to your Church. Called to embody his love in the world, we remember how on the night before Jesus died, he took bread and after giving you thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat. This is my body, given for you." In the same way, he took the cup, saying: "Take, drink. This is a sign of the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you eat and drink, remember me." We remember, Sustaining God, grateful that on this day we experience the in-breaking of your kin-dom, your new life revealed in resurrection. We proclaim the mystery of our faith:

This doesn't mean that all congregations will be Affirming. They will still need to decide that on their own. But it does mean that we will be collectively and so all meetings, committees, teams and events are to be safe, and inclusive spaces for everyone. Congratulations to FDEE Regional Council and to the Affirm Committee of the Region for getting us there.

Turn Debt into Hope Petition: Kairos, the ecumenical justice coalition of which the United Church is a part, has launched the Jubilee 2025: Turn Debt into Hope campaign. They are asking people to sign a petition to encourage governments to forgive the debt of the world's poorest nations. The petition is on the Social Action bulletin board in the foyer. Please consider signing. Kairos and the Canadian Council of Churches are trying to collect 100 thousand signatures in Canada and 10 million worldwide.

G7 People's Forum: This coming June 12-15, Kairos is hosting a People's Forum in Calgary. It is focused on the Jubilee 2025 Campaign, a year long push coordinated by the Canadian Council of Churches asking for governments to forgive the debt of the world's poorest countries. If you are going to be in Calgary, why not consider making the Forum part of your trip.
