# **THE GREAT THANKSGIVING** (based on the Northern Lights Worship Service prepared for the United Church's Centennial)

God is with us.We are not alone.Christ is present here.The Spirit is among us!Let us give thanks to Godin memory and in hope.

Blessed are you, Living God who graces this world with life and light and love. In the beginning, your Spirit moved across the deep waters. Amid emptiness and chaos, you sought connection,

And so, you created day and night, skies and seas, plants and trees, animals that fly and animals that swim, animals that walk and swing and sing, and you called all of this, all of us, good.

And over time, your Spirit continued to call forth wisdom and courage for your people, calling Miriam to dance for joy on the shores of the Red Sea, Elijah to the presence of your still, small voice after the fire and wind, and Joel to voice your promise that you will pour out your Spirit on all people, so that your children will prophesy, your elders dream dreams, your youth see visions."

Though we turned from you, you continued to pursue us in love, coming to Mary who boldly said yes and your Spirit came into the world once more, alive and embodied in Jesus, who lived with your deep passion and wisdom, boldly shared your joy and compassion, dared to dream that your kin-dom is here among us.

With gratitude for all that he did, in gratitude too for the gifting of your Spirit on Pentecost, we join your angels in a song of praise: All: O holy, holy, holy God, O God of time and space. Gracious God, Jesus' living in the Spirit's ways drew attention, both from those who sought to follow and those who were afraid. and so, we remember the courage and vision he shared with his friends on the night he was betrayed.
